




Private Lands in Utah

Of the nearly 85,000 square miles of surface area in Utah, 17,884 miles are in private ownership – only 21%. The map below shows where the privately owned land is. The maps on the reverse page show the relative size of Utah and its 29 counties if they were condensed to include only privately owned land.
